

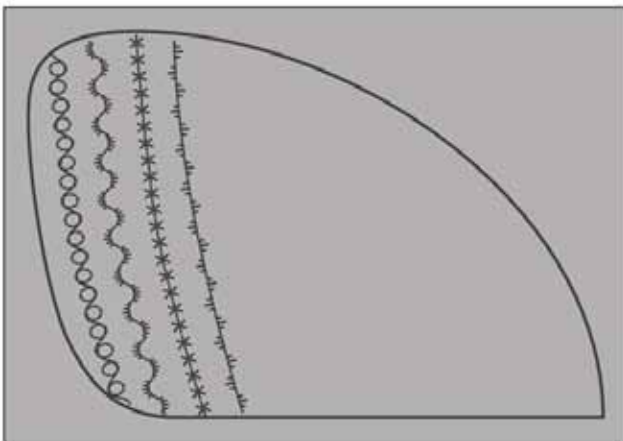


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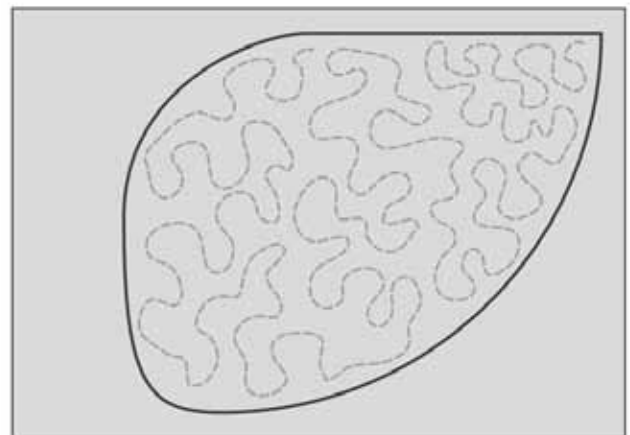
Tips & Hints "Butterfly Bag"

Finished bag dimensions: approximately 6cm (23¹/₅") x 35 cm (13³/₄")

1. Cut out the butterfly templates.
2. Determine which fabrics will be used for the different sections of the butterfly.
3. Trace template pieces onto appropriate fabrics.
4. Embellish the upper wings with several rows of decorative stitching.



5. Decorate the lower wings with free-motion stippling.

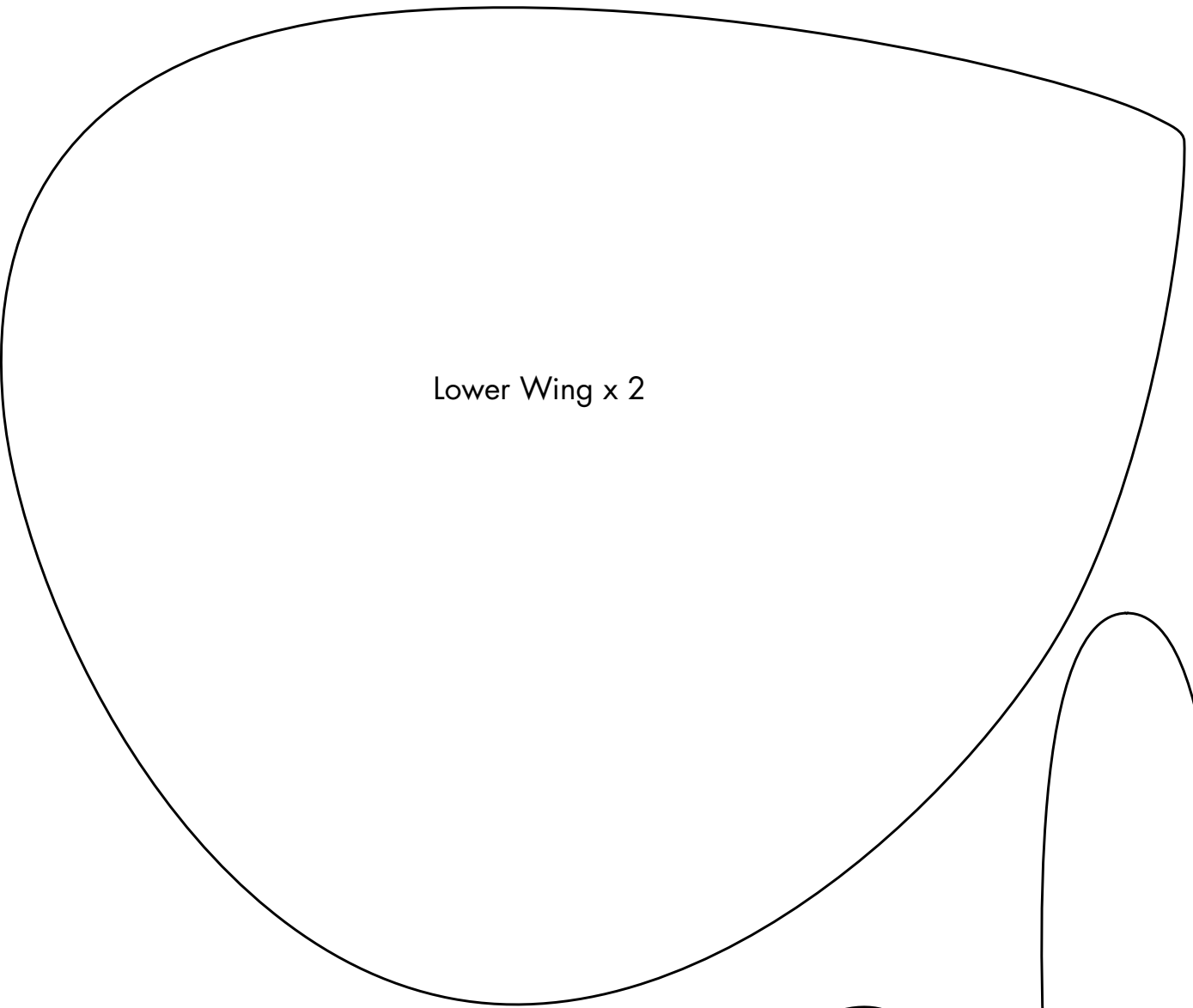


6. Apply double sided fusible web to the back side of the appliqué fabrics; cut.
7. Arrange appliqué pieces as desired and fuse to bag front.
8. Finish raw edges of appliqué with the pin stitch.
9. Use the Non-stitch foot for IDT™ system when you are sewing the handles and other details in leather.

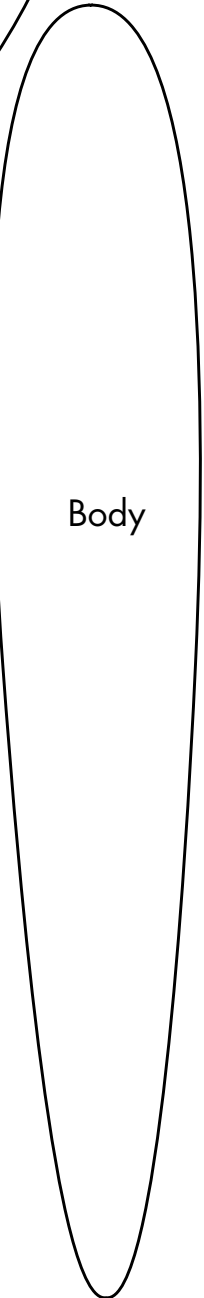
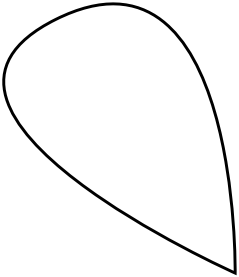
10. Apply fusible stabilizer to the back of the leather corner pieces for more structure. Never place the iron directly onto the leather. Apply interfacing to the back of the leather, using a press cloth. Use a dry iron, just hot enough to melt the glue.
11. Cut a piece of cardboard for the bottom of the bag for extra stability.
