

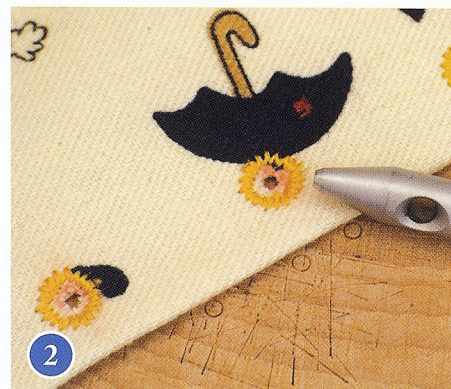
eyelets

Small embroidered holes, commonly sewn by hand, used for lacing, belt holes or decorative detail.

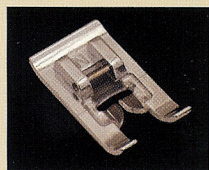
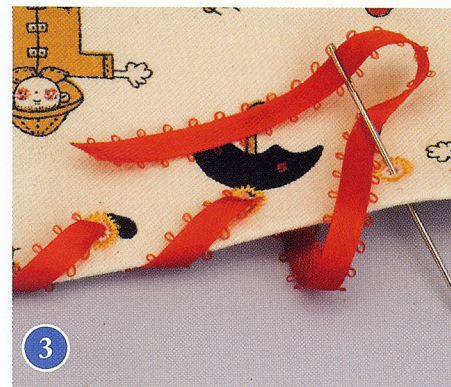
1. Mark the placement for the eyelets on your fabric with a marking pen. Stabilize your fabric with tear-away stabilizer or a second layer of fabric. Center the mark in the needle hole under the foot. (#1)



2. Once all the holes have been sewn, use an awl and a wooden block to cut open each eyelet. (#2)



3. If you use the eyelets as a decorative detail, thread ribbon through each hole along an edge. (#3)



Monogramming Foot

Stitch: Eyelet

Width: Pre-set

Length: Pre-set

Tension: Pre-set

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Cotton fabrics of choice; universal needle, size 80/12; all-purpose sewing thread for needle and for bobbin (for fine fabrics, use rayon or heirloom thread for the needle and bobbin); awl; tear-away stabilizer
