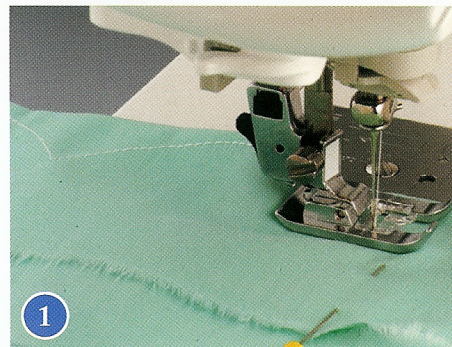


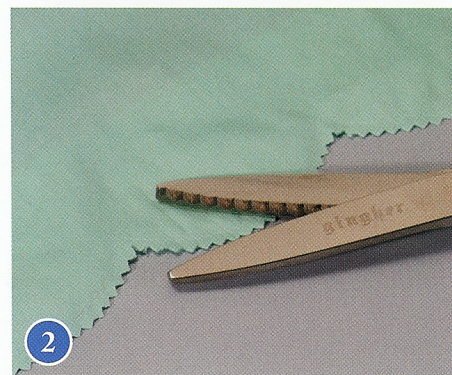
tucks — scallop

A beautiful contoured tuck often sewn as overlapping blind tucks.

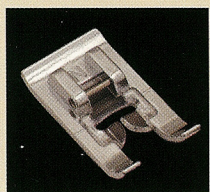
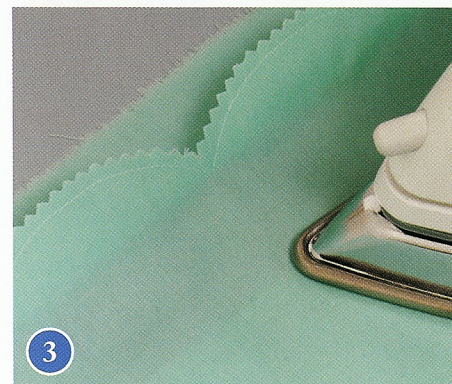
1. Measure for each scallop tuck allowing extra fabric for a seam allowance. With right sides together, press under for each scallop tuck. Select the wide straight stitch scallop and sew. (#1)



2. Using your pinking shears, carefully trim close to the line of stitching. (#2)



3. With right sides together, press for the next tuck. (#3)

Stitch: *Straight Stitch Scallop and Straight Stitch*

Width: *Pre-set*

Length: *Pre-set*

Tension: *Pre-set*

Fabric, needles, notions required:

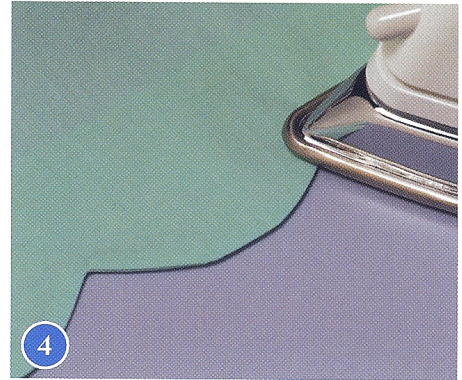
Lightweight fabrics of choice; universal needle, size 80/12; all-purpose sewing thread for needle and bobbin; pinking shears

TIP

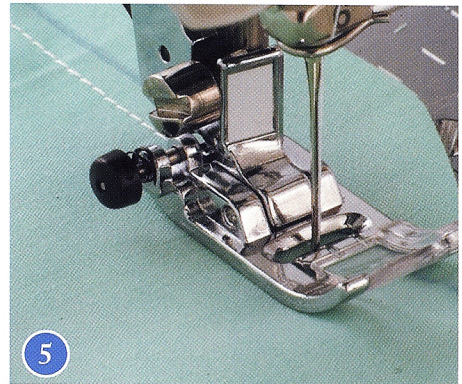
When making scallop tucks, remember to sew and trim all the scallops before turning and stitching into tucks.

tucks — scallop — cont.

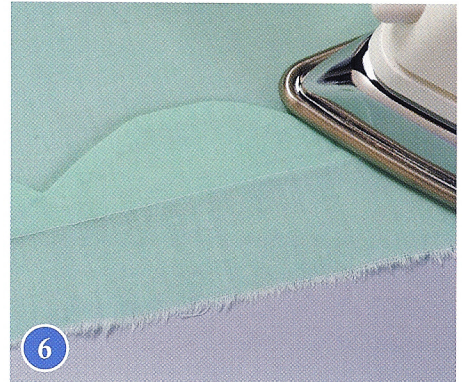
4. After all the scallops are sewn and trimmed, turn to the right side and press flat. (#4)



5. Measure in to determine how deep you want each tuck and sew. (#5)



6. After sewing the tucks, press each to one side. (#6)



TIP

Some variations of contoured tucks might be notched or sawtooth tucks. Slashed tucks such as sharks teeth are often used on heirloom or quilting or patchwork projects.
