



PFAFF® creative elevate™ 680 QUILT TECHNIQUE

This jacket is made using fabric pieced together from eight different colors. The design features hourglass quilt blocks that are sewn together, then sliced and rearranged to form a new block. You can create quilted fabric in any size you need by making additional quilt blocks. If you have a Singer Momento, you can easily cut all the pieces using the included cut file. The finished size of one block is approximately 14½" (37cm).



Cut the Fabric

Step 1: Cut half-square triangles using starting squares sized 7" or use the printable Pdf pattern associated with this project.


Tip: If you are using your MOMENTO craft-cutting machine, the included cut file will cut 18 HST pieces on a 24" x 24" mat, with the dog ears already trimmed.





Sew the Pieces Together

Step 2: Arrange the 8 different color triangles into two different color combinations. Set your sewing machine for a short stitch length (1.5 – 2mm) and sew the hourglass quilt blocks using 3/8" (1cm) seam allowance and press the seams open.




Sew the Blocks Together

Step 3: Sew four hourglass blocks together – two of each color combination. Press the seams open.



Diagonally Slice the Block

Step 4: Draw lines at a 45° angle, $2\frac{3}{4}''$ (7cm) from the center. Ensure the lines match up at the seams. Cut along the drawn lines.



Reorganize the Pieces


Step 5: Separate the pieces. Rotate triangles B, C, D, E by 90° and the center piece A by 180° .



Sew the New Block



Step 6: Sew the new block together using a 1cm (3/8") seam allowance. Make as many blocks as needed for your project.



Sew the Blocks Together

Step 7: Arrange the blocks so they all face the same direction. Sew the blocks into rows, then join the rows to make the quilt.
