

## ALL ABOUT the fringe/looping foot

Add textural elements or just mark important pattern details using the fringe/looping foot. The center bar (1) creates loops with the thread that can be seen on the surface of the fabric. The thread loops slide off the back of the bar as you are sewing. The bottom of the foot in the back is cut away (2) to make sure the thread releases easily.

Chenille trim and heirloom fagoting are just a few of the other techniques that can be sewn with this foot.



### tailor tacks

For traditional tailor tacks, set your machine for a zigzag stitch. For dot markings, lower the feed dogs to sew in one place. For marking darts or other types of pattern markings, keep the feed dogs raised.

Select a zigzag stitch with a width between 2mm and 5mm. With any narrower stitch or a straight stitch, the needle will hit the bar. Loosen the needle tension slightly and begin sewing making sure the needle does not hit the fringe/looping foot.
