



Fabric Cutting Tips for a 3-color, 9" finished Churn Dash block:





Place fabric over shapes then run through the cutter:


For best cutting results, position fabric on the lengthwise grain (straight of grain) as it goes under the roller. The die is specially designed to cut a 3-color, 9" finished churn dash block in one pass through the cutter.

- Shape A (Center Square): Cut a 4" strip across the width of fabric. Fanfold into 4" widths. Cut 10 squares across the width of fabric. One yard of 40" wide fabric cuts 90 squares.
- Shape B (Rectangles): Cut a 4½" strip across the width of fabric. Fanfold into 4" widths. Cut 20 rectangles across the width of fabric. One yard of 40" wide fabric cuts 160 rectangles.
- Shape C (Half Square Triangles): Cut a 43/4" strip across the width of fabric. Fanfold into 4" widths. Cut 20 half square triangles across the width of fabric. One yard of 40" wide fabric cuts 140 half square triangles.

Shapes needed for 9" finished Churn Dash Block









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How to Sew the Churn Dash Quilt Block:

Step 1




Sew one Fabric #1 piece B to one Fabric #2 piece B. Make four units.

Step 3



Sew one B/B unit onto either side of piece A as shown to make the middle row.

Step 5




Sew bottom row to middle row as shown.

Step 2




Sew one Fabric #1 piece C to one Fabric #3 piece C. Make four units.

Step 4



Sew one C/C unit to either side of one B/B unit as shown. Make two rows.

Step 6



Sew top row to other two rows to complete the Churn Dash Block.
