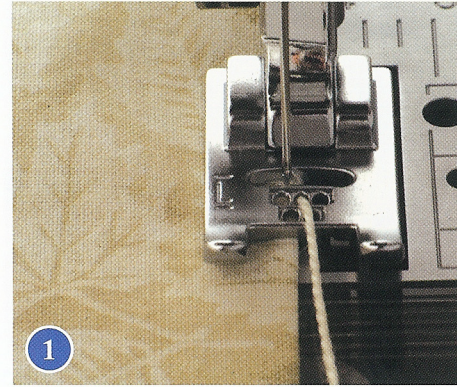


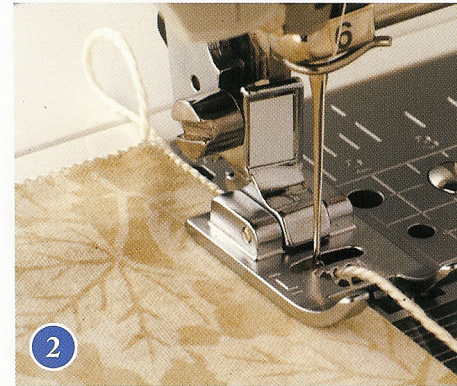
# edge finishes — corded edge

*A fine edge finish used on heirloom garments and fine linens. This is the perfect edge finish for table linens and napkins.*

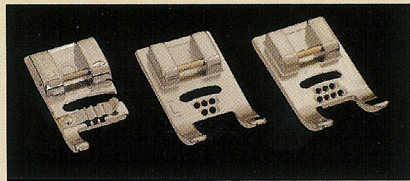
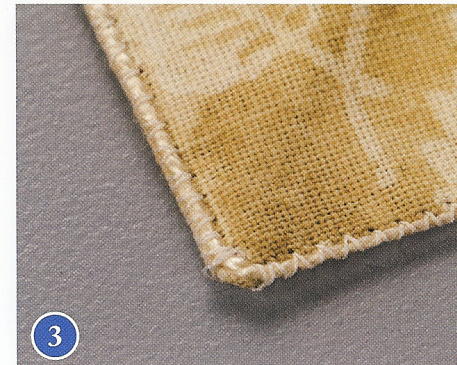
1. First, mark and turn back the edge creating as deep a hem as desired. Miter the corner. Thread the pearl cotton through the middle hole on the 5-hole cording foot. Select the zigzag stitch and adjust the width so the right swing just falls off the edge of the fabric and the left swing catches the edge. Begin sewing to the corner. (#1)



2. At the corner, stop with the needle in the fabric and pull a loop of pearl cotton behind the foot. Carefully pivot the fabric keeping the loop behind the foot and the cord to the right of the needle. Continue stitching down the other side of the edge. (#2)



3. Once all corners are completed, carefully pull the cord to tighten it at the corners. This finish is perfect for collars, cuffs or heirloom linens. (#3)



**3-, 5-, or 7-hole Cording Foot**

**Stitch:** Zigzag

**Width:** 2.0 - 2.5mm

**Length:** 0.9mm

**Tension:** Pre-set

**Fabric, needles, notions required:**

*Fine cottons, linens, or stable silks; universal needle, size 70/10; rayon or fine heirloom cotton thread for needle and bobbin; pearl cotton; water- or air-soluble marking pen*
