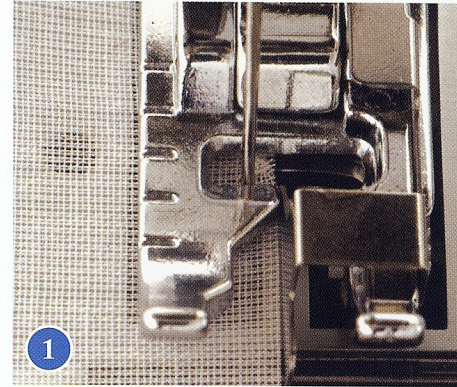


edge finishes — rolled edge

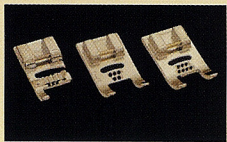
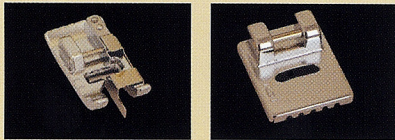
A fine rolled edge used to prepare fabric edges for heirloom sewing or finishing the edge of fine fabrics.

1. Place the edge of the fabric against the edge of the blade. Set your machine for a short, narrow zigzag stitch. The right needle swing should fall off the edge of the fabric. As you sew, the fabric edge will roll in slightly to produce a fine edge finish. (#1)



FOOT FACTS

When using the pintuck foot or the 3-hole cording foot, the fine rolled edge should slide through the groove on the bottom of the foot as you sew. Adjust your needle position so the roll slides into the groove.



Edge Joining Foot or Pintuck Foot or 3-hole Cording Foot

Stitch: Zigzag

Width: 2.5-3.5mm

Length: 0.7mm

Tension: Pre-set

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Fine fabrics of choice such as linen, silk, or cotton batiste; universal needle, size 70/10; heirloom sewing or silk thread for needle and for bobbin; appliqué or embroidery scissors
