


scallops — corded

Create a beautiful edge finish with a corded scallop.

1. Replace the bobbin cover with the cord guide bobbin cover and thread the gimp cord through the top and up through the slot. (#1)



2. Select the scallop stitch and adjust the stitch length if necessary to make a tight satin stitch. Draw a line on the fabric about 1" from the edge to keep the scallop stitching straight. Place a piece of tear-away stabilizer under the fabric. Center the open toe foot over the line and begin stitching. The gimp cord should follow the direction of the stitch and be caught in the bobbin thread. (#2)



 Carefully tear-away the stabilizer. Trim the fabric close the scallop stitching. (#3)

Stitch: Scallop Stitch

Width: Pre-set

Length: 0.3mm

Tension: Pre-set

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Fine fabrics of choice; universal needle, size 70/10 or 80/12; rayon or cotton embroidery thread for needle and bobbinfil for bobbin; gimp cord;

tear-away stabilizer

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If you do not own a cord guide bobbin cover, the filler cord can be fed into the stitch from the top. Thread the cord from the front of the foot and under the back. Place the fabric and tear-away stabilizer under the foot. Holding the cord slightly up and in your right hand, begin to stitch the scallop. The movement of the needle should carry the cord back and forth and be covered with the zigzag as the scallop stitch is being formed. Trim the edge of the fabric away as described above.
