## SEWING SUPPLIES

H|CLASS ${ }^{\text {"' }}$ I00Q sewing machine by HUSQVARNA VIKING ${ }^{\oplus}$ $10-12$ different fabric strips in coordinated colors, 2 " $\times 32$ " $(5 \times 80 \mathrm{~cm})$
Watersoluble stabilizer, $82^{\prime \prime} \times 10^{\prime \prime}(205 \times 25 \mathrm{~cm})$
$1 / 4^{\prime \prime}(6 \mathrm{~mm})$ wide Steam A Seam II - Fusible fabric adhesive
Robison Anton 30 wt . rayon embroidery thread in matching color.
DMC hand embroidery thread: Pearl Cotton Variations, 4 skeins in matching colors to your shawl fabrics.
Pictogram pen
Rotary cutter, cutting mat and quilting ruler
Straight pins

## CUTTING SQUARES

- Cut the fabric strips into $2^{\prime \prime}(5 \mathrm{~cm})$ square pieces.


## SEWING TIP

Because there will probably be a lot of left over fabrics, gather your friends and all of you can sew a shawl.

## SEWING THE SHAWL

- On the 82 " $\times 10^{\prime \prime}(205 \times 25 \mathrm{~cm})$ water soluble stabilizer measure in I" ( 2.5 cm ) on one long side and both short ends and draw horizontal and vertical lines 2 " ( 5 cm ) apart to create a 2 " $\times 2$ " ( $5 \times 5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) grid.
- Pin the $2^{\prime \prime}$ squares randomly over the grid.
- Thread the H|CLASS ${ }^{\text {Tm }} 100 \mathrm{Q}$ sewing machine with 30 wt . rayon embroidery thread both in top and in bobbin.
- Attach presser foot B and select stitch I I, a serpentine stitch.
- Sew on the grid lines over each fabric square edge, covering all edges including outside edges. Remove pins as you come to them.
- Dissolve the stabilizer in water.


## ADDING THE FRINGE

- Fuse one side of the Steam a Seam II strips close to the edge of each short end of the shawl. Remove paper.
- Cut the DMC embroidery thread into desired lengths and arrange on top of the Steam A Seam II strip with threads separated.
- Iron the threads to fuse them to the shawl.
- Sew a straight stitch across the threads.
- Cut and trim the fringe to an even length.
