


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Carnival

Lotta Jansdotter's Follie looks fabulous paired with a number of bold solids in these fun elongated triangles. Keep the prints grouped together to really make the fabrics shine! A variety of gray solids provide the perfect background.





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Fabric Requirements:

(number in parentheses indicates the # of triangles and half triangles to cut from each fabric)

Follie prints:

1 fat eighth of each print (9" x 22")

Fabric B - 39272-2 (7)

Fabric C - 39270-5 (7)

Fabric D - 39275-8 (7)

Fabric E - 39273-2 (5 + (2) 1/2 triangles)

Fabric F - 39271-3 (7)

Fabric G - 39272-7 (7)

Fabric H - 39275-9 (5)

Fabric I - 39272-6 (6)

Fabric K - 39274-3 (7 + (1) 1/2 triangle)

Fabric 6 - 1930's light green - 31837 (12 + (1) 1/2 triangle)

Fabric 7 - 1930's pink - 25025 (10 + (2) 1/2 triangles)

1 fat eighth:

Fabric 8 - mediterranean - 37098-30 (7 + (1) 1/2 triangle)

1/4 yard:

Fabric 9 - chalk 37098-12 (16 + (1) 1/2 triangle)

3/4 yard:

Fabric 10 - grey cloud - 353621-9 (42 + (3) 1/2 triangles)

Backing:

Fabric O - 39276-9 - 4 1/4 yards

Binding:

Fabric P - 39274-7 - 1/2 yard

Assembling the quilt top:

Note: ¼" seam allowance throughout

Cut triangles from Lotta Jansdotter's Follie prints and coordinating solids using Pointy Triangle Template. Number of triangles (and half triangles) required per print/solid are noted above in the fabric requirements section in parentheses.

[Triangles measure 8 1/4" in height, 1/4" along top edge, and 5" along bottom edge.]

Sew triangles together in rows, according to the quilt diagram, Align triangles right sides together, offsetting them by ¼" as shown above.

Due to the nature of these pointy triangles, about a ¼" will need to be trimmed from the top and bottom edge so the points align correctly.

Tip: Sew together 5-6 triangles in sections, iron seams and trim the top and bottom edge, leaving ¼" above the triangle points.

Sew sections together, again offsetting the triangles by 1/4".

Sew rows together in pairs, pinning where each triangle point meets, then sew pairs together until all rows are sewn together. Completed quilt top should measure about 61" x 72".

Assembling the backing:

From the backing fabric (O), cut the 4 1/4 yard piece in half so you have two pieces measuring about 76" x width of fabric. Trim selvages from both pieces. Sew together along the long edge. Trim excess from one side so backing piece measures about 65" x 76".

Finishing:

- 1. Layer the backing, batting, and top. Baste as desired.
- 2. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Trim the edges to square the quilt.
- 4. Cut (7) 2.5" strips from binding fabric (P). Make and attach the binding, following your desired binding method.
